Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, Friends and Strangers alike,

Starting the day after Thanksgiving, I play and then repeat over



and over, the Vince Guaraldi Trio soundtrack to *A Charlie Brown Christmas*. Okay, okay, maybe I play that soundtrack nearly all year but this is the time of year, I play it out loud for *everyone* to hear. Though, per the request of various family members, I am limited to doing that no more than twice a day.

We all have traditions, especially this time of year. Traditions mark the passage of our time. It is good to keep them. The Christmas Season is full of traditions. But truth is more important than any tradition.

Once the leaves turn to crunch underfoot, tradition brings our national day of Thanksgiving (thanksgiving for many but not all). This year, that very same weekend our Advent Season began. "I was raised in the Roman Catholic

tradition. This morning I invited a Muslim friend of mine, new to Nahant, to attend a service at the Nahant Village (Protestant) Church to hear a Jewish woman and dear friend speak on how her religious heritage informed her love of nature and her career as one of the world's top environmental scientists.

My new friend made more new friends and we all benefited from the welcoming atmosphere."

A friend who was a roommate of mine when I lived at 21 High Street starting in 1973 added a comment with an allusion to a Hebrew greeting, to which I responded:

"Tom Fair's intended Hebrew "Peace be with you" comment, "Shalom aleichem," has its equivalent in Arabic, "as-salāmuʿalaikum." Rusty Chadwick, who led the service at the Nahant Village Church, conveyed the same message as did the Imam who spoke at the graveside service of my friend and neighbor, Khalid Abaddy, who died this past week. The wonderful priest from my childhood, Fr. Douglas A. Morrison, who remains a treasured friend to this day, would have chimed in with "pax vobiscom" if he was on Facebook...which, at 91 Years old, he decidedly is not.

Isn't it sad that Facebook seems at times to bring out the worst in people? There are other alternatives.

I am so happy to have been able to share my recent, peace-in-any-language, experiences with friends and neighbors.
